

Construction continues expansion as NEFL region grows

The Construction industry continues expansion with increases in horizontal road construction as well as residential and commercial building.

The construction industry relies heavily on purchases from the supply chain, also strengthening the region's economy.

Our region's Career and Technical Education academies provide a natural feeder system into pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship programs, such as those at the Northeast Florida Builder's Association (NEFBA) and the Electrical Training Alliance at Jacksonville (ETA).

Annual demand according to JobsEQ is up **4.6% in the last ten years** for non-commercial electrical, **5.3%** for residential plumbing and HVAC, and **9.8%** for highway, street and bridge construction. Overall demand is double that when compared to the U.S.

As our region's population expands, a potential market for resident and commercial interior design professionals grows as well.

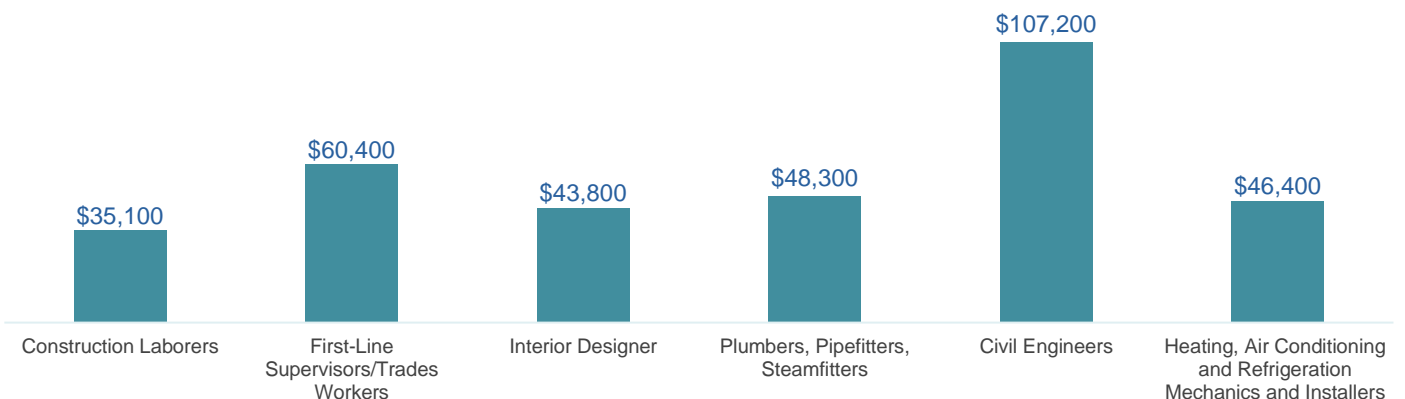
The occupations shown below represent a cross-section of entry-, mid- and executive-level positions.

INDUSTRY EMPLOYERS (2020)

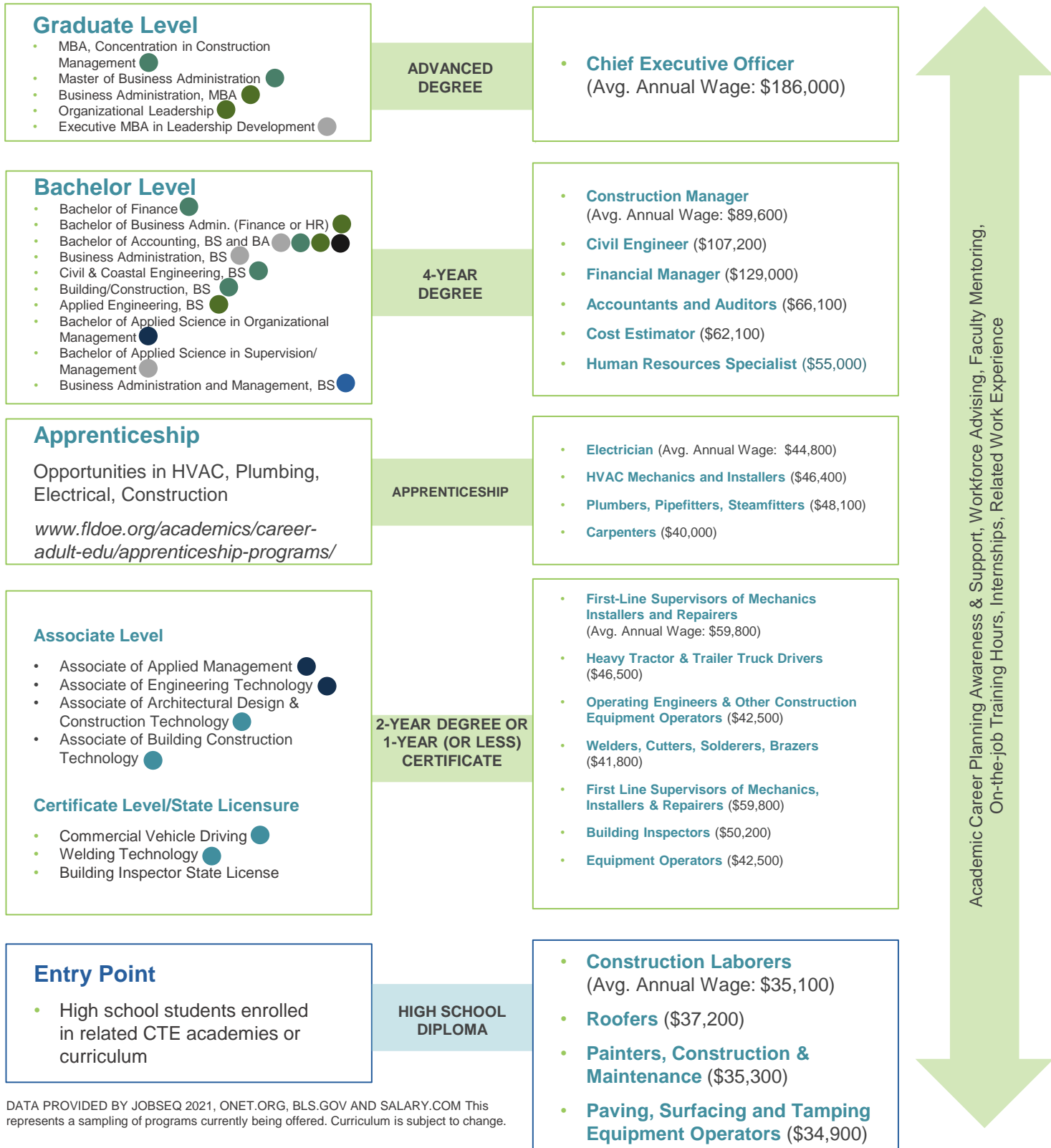

Construction of Florida State Road 23/First Coast Expressway

Often individuals associate careers in construction with building residential or commercial buildings, or vertical construction. Significant opportunities exist in horizontal construction as well—building the infrastructure that impacts how our region moves goods and people each day which significantly impacts the economy.

According to claycountygov.com, The First Coast Expressway (FCE) project is the result of a partnership between the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District 2 and Florida's Turnpike Enterprise. The FCE is a multi-lane, limited access, all electronic toll road that, once completed, will span 46 miles across parts of Duval, Clay and St. Johns counties.

The first phase has been built which links Middleburg to I-10. This four-lane expressway will connect Green Cove Springs near the World Golf Village to I-95. Ultimately, the Expressway will run through St. Johns County as well. All phases of construction will be completed around the end of the 2020s decade.
