
A significant aspect of public service involves working in public safety. Public safety provides a proactive as well as reactive approach to protecting individuals as part of local, state, and national jurisdictions. Jobs in this sector are typically extensions of government entities who are tasked with keeping the public safe from harm, including anything from widespread disasters to individual crimes. According to Wikipedia, "public safety organizations include law enforcement, fire and emergency medical services."

A multitude of jobs exist in this sector, from crime prevention to response and aid. Occupations in this field include police officers, EMS personnel, probation officers, and lawyers, for example. Some positions may be funded through government specific grants to address specific local crime issues, while others are obtained through public election.
