"Artis the activity by which a person, having experienced and emotion, intentionally transmits it to others." - Leo Tolstoy


The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines art as "the conscious use of skill and creative imagination especially in the production of aesthetic objects. Regardless about how you define art, there are career opportunities to be had in Northeast Florida which has a rich history in the arts, particularly in early filmmaking and music.

### Although defining art can be difficult, there are three primary types of art careers, all of which require specific skill sets:

Applied Art, Fine Art and Digital Art. Jobs in these subsets of the arts could range from architecture and multimedia to courtroom sketch artist, screen printer, woodworker, tattoo artist, photography, or performing arts.

Skills that may be used include CAD, Adobe Photoshop, In design, or Adobe Creative Suite. If interested in the arts, you could glean these skills while in high school career and technical education classes.


The occupations shown below represent a cross-section of entry-, mid- and executive-level positions within the arts.

The Jacoby Symphony Hall has garnered a national reputation for excellence and has hosted a myriad of renowned musicians. ### **Spotlight on New MOSH**

The Museum of Science and History (MOSH), enlivens the arts and culture scene of our region and recently announced renderings of the museums new location, an \$85 million+ facility situated on Jacksonville's Northbank. The museum's architecture committee's artistic and innovative renderings for the building were brought about by 8 months of site evaluations, community input and discussion with the MOSH site committee. The design was inspired by the flow of water throughout Jacksonville's history, which has played an integral role in our city's development. The terraces of the building will rise from the river towards the city with a pathway connecting 3 themed exhibit spaces.
